Some things to consider...

Plans are lines on sheets of paper whereas design is how the building will look, feel and work for the duration of its lifetime. Those lines on paper, are committing homeowners to a very large outlay in time and money. Good design is a very small percentage of the overall cost of a building. Get it wrong and the ramifications are enormous but get it right and the benefits are huge.

A typical, high quality package should contain a Window Schedule, Insulation Schedule, Colour Schedule, Electrical Layout and Bill of Quantities, an Energy Rating — Basix Certificate with high scores on energy efficiency. There should be consideration of nontoxic paints and finishes or products to be in the build and a schedule of P.C. items, and allowances. Kitchen and Bathroom design and driveway and landscape plans are normally optional.

Does the builder have a detailed set of construction documents that include all the schedules listed above? This will allow builders to prepare an accurate tender price i.e. comparing "apples with apples".

Finally, and probably most importantly, does your designer 'get it'? Do they understand you and where you're coming from? Are you on the same page and do you feel comfortable that they will support you and are really interested in achieving a successful outcome for you and your family? If you are feeling that the entire process isn't satisfactory and your designer isn't listening or producing a design you feel happy with, then consider leaving sooner rather than later. This could save you a lot of time, grief and money.
